AN ACT MAKING CERTAIN CHANGES IN THE LAW CONCERNING
DESIGNATION OF POLLING PLACES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 24 of chapter 54 of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended by chapter 118 of the acts of 1966, is
3 hereby further amended by striking out the fifth sentence of
4 said section.
