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AN ACT TO PROVIDE COMPENSATION TO MEDICAL CONSULTANTS IN  
STATE SERVICE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as  
follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any other general or special law to  
2 the contrary, any physician or dentist or other person, regis-  
3 tered under General Laws, chapter one hundred and twelve,  
4 other than a person receiving a salary from the common-  
5 wealth shall be entitled to reimbursement under Public Laws  
6 89-97, Massachusetts Medical Service or other third party  
7 payor, for services rendered to a patient in any institution  
8 operated by the commonwealth or any municipality within  
9 the commonwealth.
