AN ACT ALLOWING REPRESENTATIVES OF EMPLOYEE ORGANIZATIONS TO APPEAR BEFORE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE HEARINGS WITHOUT LOSS OF COMPENSATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Employee organizations as defined in section 178G of
2 chapter 149 of the General Laws shall have the right to
3 designate a representative of such organization to appear and
4 testify before legislative committees of the general court on
5 bills of interest to such organizations without loss of compen-
6 sation, provided that notice of intent to so appear and the
7 name of the representative is furnished the municipal em-
8 ployer at least three days prior to the date of the hearing at
9 which the organization wishes to be represented.

THE ORGANIZATION OF REPRESENTATIVES

in the House of Representatives

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE ORGANIZATION OF REPRESENTATIVES IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ORGANIZATION OF COMMITTEES AND SUBCOMMITTEES.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the said Senate and House of Representatives, on July 11, 1907.

1. Employees organizations as defined in section 178C of chapter 152 of the General Laws shall have the right to designate a representative of such organization to appear and testify before legislative committees of the general court on bills of interest to such organizations without loss of compensation, provided that notice of intent to so appear and the name of the representative is furnished the municipal clerk at least three days prior to the date of the hearing at which the organization wishes to be represented.
