AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE HOUSING OF INMATES ON DAY WORK.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 86D of chapter 127 of the General Laws is hereby

- 4 All such inmates shall, while so employed by the day, be
- 5 fed, housed and supervised outside the confines of the walls
