AN ACT ELIMINATING CERTAIN EXEMPTIONS IN THE SALES TAX LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 6 of chapter 64H of the General Laws,
2 as inserted by chapter 757 of the acts of 1967, is hereby
3 amended in subsection (j) by striking out the words "or in
4 the operation of aircraft".

1 SECTION 2. Said section 6 of chapter 64H is hereby further
2 amended in subsection (m) by striking out the words
3 "newspapers, magazines," and the words ", and motion
4 picture films for commercial exhibition".

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect July first, nineteen
2 hundred and sixty-nine.
