AN ACT TO PROVIDE ANNUAL PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS TO ALL PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS IN POVERTY AREAS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 53 of chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by adding at the end thereof the following:—
- 3 In urban areas designated by the commissioner of labor and
- 4 industries as low-income areas, school physicians shall make
- 5 an annual physical examination of all children whether or not
- 6 they have applied for health certificates, but no pupil shall be
- 7 required to undergo a physical examination if his parent or
- 8 guardian is of any religious denomination conscientiously
- 9 opposed to medical practise, or is himself so opposed, and
- 10 the school committee is so notified in writing. In cases where
- 11 examination reveals a need for medication or inoculation, the
- 12 commissioner of public health shall cooperate with the school
- 13 to provide the supplies needed, and may if necessary arrange
- 14 to share the cost.
