

HOUSE No. 2835

By Mr. Walsh of Boston, petition of Joseph B. Walsh and another for extending rights of appeal to certain persons under the non-contributory retirement system. Public Service.

AN ACT EXTENDING RIGHTS OF APPEAL TO CERTAIN PERSONS UNDER THE NON-CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by inserting after section 101 the following new section:—

3 *Section 102.* The provisions of subdivision (4) of section six-
4 teen shall apply to any person aggrieved by an action taken or
5 decision of a retirement board or appropriate public authority
6 rendered, or by failure of a retirement board or appropriate pub-
7 lic authority rendered, or by failure of a retirement board or
8 appropriate public authority to act within ninety days after
9 date application was filed with such retirement board or ap-
10 propriate retirement authority provided, that the payment of
11 expenses connected therewith under the provisions of any sec-
12 tion of the chapter, other than sections one to twenty-eight, shall
13 be paid from the same source from which employee's compensa-
14 tion was paid.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall not apply to any person who is
2 subject to the provisions of sections sixty-five A to sixty-seven
3 of this chapter.

BY THE BOARD OF HEALTH, BOSTON, IN ORDER TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT IN THAT BEHALF PASSED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS.

AS IT APPEARS BY THE REPORT OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH, BOSTON, FOR THE YEAR ENDING ON THE 31ST DAY OF DECEMBER, 1901, THAT THE BOARD OF HEALTH, BOSTON, HAS BEEN ORGANIZED AND IS NOW IN OPERATION.

1. The Board of Health, Boston, was organized on the 1st day of January, 1901.
2. The Board of Health, Boston, has since that time been engaged in the study and execution of its duties.
3. The Board of Health, Boston, has found that the present organization of the Board is not sufficient to enable it to perform its duties efficiently.
4. The Board of Health, Boston, therefore recommends that the Board be reorganized.
5. The Board of Health, Boston, recommends that the Board be composed of seven members.
6. The Board of Health, Boston, recommends that the Board be organized into three divisions.
7. The Board of Health, Boston, recommends that the Board be empowered to make and enforce regulations.
8. The Board of Health, Boston, recommends that the Board be empowered to make and enforce orders.
9. The Board of Health, Boston, recommends that the Board be empowered to make and enforce rules.
10. The Board of Health, Boston, recommends that the Board be empowered to make and enforce laws.
11. The Board of Health, Boston, recommends that the Board be empowered to make and enforce decrees.
12. The Board of Health, Boston, recommends that the Board be empowered to make and enforce edicts.
