

HOUSE No. 2865

By Merris Buttiglieri of Boston and George DiLorenzo of Boston, petition of Richard Grillo that the Massachusetts Port Authority be required to sell to the city of Boston a certain parcel of land in the East Boston district of said city and providing for use of said land for recreational purposes. AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE TRANSFER OF A PIECE OF LAND IN EAST BOSTON FROM THE MASSACHUSETTS PORT AUTHORITY TO THE CITY OF BOSTON DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION AND FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF SAID LAND.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 On or before September first, nineteen hundred and sixty-
2 nine, the Massachusetts Port Authority shall sell to the city
3 of Boston department of parks and recreation for the price of
4 ten dollars a piece of land in the East Boston district of Bos-
5 ton bounded generally by the Airport Service road, Porter
6 street, the former Airport Service road and the rear of the
7 property lines of house lots of such houses as remain on Mave-
8 rick street adjacent to this piece of land, or Maverick street
9 itself.

10 The city of Boston parks and recreation department shall
11 make such improvements as it deems necessary to bring the
12 land to an acceptable condition for recreational uses.

The Commission was organized on July 1, 1911, and its first report was submitted to the Board of City Commissioners on July 1, 1911. The Commission has since that time been engaged in a study of the various departments of the City, and has submitted to the Board of City Commissioners several reports on the subject of the reorganization of the City government.
