AN ACT REGULATING THE CONSTRUCTION OF PRIVATELY OPERATED AIRPORTS AND RESTRICTED LANDING AREAS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby amended by strik-
2 ing out section 39B, as most recently amended by chapter
3 505 of the acts of 1948, and inserting in place thereof the fol-
4 lowing section:—

5 *Section 39B.* Each city or town and person before acquir-
6 ing any property within the commonwealth for the purpose of
7 establishing, constructing, enlarging or improving thereon
8 an airport or restricted landing area, shall apply to the com-
9 mission for a certificate of approval of the site. Before grant-
10 ing a certificate of approval for an airport or restricted land-
11 ing area, the commission may, and upon the request of a
12 resident of such city or town shall, hold a public hearing in
13 the city or town where such airport or restricted landing area
14 is to be located and at least seven days' notice of such hearing
15 shall be published by the commission in a newspaper of gen-
16 eral circulation in such city or town. The commission may
17 authorize one member or the director to hold such a hearing.

18 No such certificate of approval of a site for an airport or
19 restricted landing area shall be issued by the commission if
20 such airport or area is situated on any lake or pond outside
21 the metropolitan area, unless such site has previously been
22 approved by the mayor and city council of the city, or at
23 an annual or special town meeting of the town, within which
24 the same is located.
