## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO CONSTRUCT THE OLD HARTFORD TURNPIKE IN THE TOWNS OF UPTON AND NORTHBRIDGE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 The department of public works is hereby authorized and
- 2 directed to construct the Old Hartford Turnpike, so called,
- 3 from Route 140 in the town of Upton and including a portion
- 4 of Upton street therein to Route 122 in the town of North-
- 5 bridge. For such purpose the department may take necessary
- 6 land or other property by eminent domain, gift, grant, deed
- 7 or otherwise. Such construction shall be made by the use of
- 8 federal and state funds. After the construction of said high-
- 9 way the care and control thereof shall be assumed by the
- 10 towns of Upton and Northbridge. Said highway shall be
- 11 maintained under the provisions of chapter ninety of the
- 12 General Laws.
- 13 The cost of the construction of said highway shall be paid
- 14 from such sum as shall be appropriated therefor.
