### AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE POSSESSION OF RADIOS CAPABLE OF RECEIVING POLICE TRANSMISSIONS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 269 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding  
2 after section 15 the following section:—

3 *Section 16.* Whoever, except as provided by law, carries on  
4 his person, or carries on his person or under his control in a  
5 vehicle, a radio capable of receiving police radio transmissions,  
6 shall be punished by imprisonment in a jail or house of correction  
7 for not more than six months or by a fine of not more than two  
8 hundred dollars.
