AN ACT AUTHORIZING CITIES AND TOWNS TO PAY THE SALARIES OF LAY TEACHERS IN PRIVATE SCHOOLS SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE CURRICULUM TAUGHT THEREIN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 5 of chapter 40 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after clause (61), added by chapter 90
3 of the acts of 1967, the following clause:—

4 (62) For the payment of the salaries of lay teachers in pri-
5 vate schools, including physical education teachers, provided,
6 however, that the curriculum therein has been approved by
7 the school committee of the city or town in which said school
8 is located.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 5 of chapter 81A of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by inserting after clause (c), which is chapter 81A
- 3 of the acts of 1907, the following clause:—
- 4 (d) For the purpose of the section of the acts hereby amended,
- 5 the words "including special education" shall be construed to
- 6 mean, that the curriculum therein has been approved by
- 7 the school committee of the city or town in which such school
- 8 is located.
