AN ACT REPEALING THE LAW PROVIDING THAT EVIDENCE OF ADVANCED PAYMENTS, PARTIAL PAYMENTS AND SETTLEMENT OF CERTAIN CLAIMS BY INSURERS AND OTHERS SHALL NOT BE ADMISSIBLE AT A TRIAL ON THE ISSUE OF LIABILITY OR TO MITIGATE DAMAGES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Sections one hundred and forty B and one hundred and
- 2 forty C of chapter two hundred and thirty-one of the General
- 3 Laws are hereby repealed.
