AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THIRD AND FOURTH ASSISTANT CLERKS IN THE DISTRICT COURT OF LOWELL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 10 of chapter 218 of the General Laws
2 is hereby amended by striking out the second paragraph,
3 inserted by section 2 of chapter 812 of the acts of 1967, and
4 inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:—

5 Third assistant clerks with salaries payable by the county
6 may be appointed in the municipal court of the Roxbury
7 district, the municipal court of the Brighton district, the
8 municipal court of the Dorchester district, the municipal
9 court of the West Roxbury district and, subject to the
10 approval of the county commissioners, in the first district
11 court of eastern Middlesex, the district court of Springfield,
12 the third district court of eastern Middlesex, the district court
13 of Lowell, the district court of East Norfolk, the district court
14 of southern Essex, the district court of Somerville and the
15 central district court of Worcester.

1 SECTION 2. Said section 10 of said chapter 218 is hereby
2 further amended by striking out the third paragraph, as most
3 recently amended by chapter 667 of the acts of 1968, and
4 inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:—

5 Fourth assistant clerks with salaries payable by the county
6 may be appointed in the municipal court of the Dorchester
7 district and in the municipal court of the West Roxbury
8 district and, subject to the approval of the county commis-
9 sioners, in the district court of Lowell, the district court of
10 East Norfolk, and in the district court of southern Essex.
