### AN ACT REACTIVATING A CERTAIN HOSPITAL INSPECTOR CIVIL SERVICE LIST.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to  
2 defeat its purpose, which is to provide for the correction of  
3 an inequity on the appointment of a hospital inspector,  
4 adult health, department of public health, therefore it is  
5 hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the  
6 immediate preservation of the public convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as  
follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the eligible list  
2 established for hospital inspector, adult health, department  
3 of public health, which expired on February twenty-first,  
4 nineteen hundred and sixty-eight, is hereby reactivated as  
5 it appeared on said date of expiration for the purpose of  
6 certifying from such list for appointment to fill the next  
7 permanent vacancy occurring therein.
