

HOUSE No. 3386

By Mr. Harrison of Gloucester, petition of David E. Hairison that purchases of the American flag be exempt from the sales tax. Taxation.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT PURCHASES OF THE AMERICAN FLAG SHALL
BE EXEMPT FROM THE SALES TAX.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 Paragraph (m) of section 6 of chapter 64H of the General
2 Laws, as appearing in section 1 of chapter 757 of the acts of
3 1967, is hereby amended by striking out said paragraph (m) and
4 inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:—

5 (m) Sales of the American flag, newspapers, magazines, books
6 required for instructional purposes in educational institutions,
7 books used for religious worship, publications of any corpora-
8 tion, foundation, organization or institution described in para-
9 graph (c) of this section, and motion picture films for commercial
10 exhibition.

The Amendments to the Constitution

Amendment No. 1

That the right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no Warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized.

That no Soldier, in peacetime, shall be quartered in any house without the consent of the owner, nor shall the right of the people to be free from unreasonable and oppressive taxes be infringed.

That the right of the people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed, and that the right of the States to appoint Militia Officers shall not be infringed.

That no State shall enter into any Treaty, Alliance, or Confederation with any other State, or with any foreign Power, or engage in any War, without the consent of the Congress, unless authorized by the Constitution, or in cases of imminent danger, when no more can be done.

That no State shall be deprived of its equal Suffrage in the Senate, and that no State shall be deprived of its equal Representation in the House of Representatives.
