AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE LAWS APPLICABLE TO ABSENTEE VOTING
IN ELECTIONS BE EXTENDED TO ALL PRIMARIES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 53 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting at the end of section 24, as appearing in
3 the Tercentenary Edition, the following sentence:—The pro-
4 visions of sections eighty-six through one hundred and three
5 A, inclusive of chapter fifty-four shall apply to all primaries.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I, Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 1. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch in that State.

Section 2. (1) The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch in that State. (2) No Person shall be a Representative who shall not, when elected, have seven Years since he last attained to the Age of twenty one Years, and seven Years since he last became a Citizen of the United States; and when elected shall have been seven Years a Citizen of that State in which he shall be chosen. (3) No Person shall be a Representative who shall not, when elected, have been seven Years a Citizen of that State in which he shall be chosen.

Section 3. This art shall take effect as soon as possible.
