## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine.

AN ACT REALLOCATING CERTAIN JOB GROUPS OF THE PUBLIC WORKS BUILDING POLICE IN THE GENERAL SALARY SCHEDULE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the  
2 director of personnel and standardization shall change the job  
3 groups of the following titles in the general salary schedule of the  
4 commonwealth as follows:—

5 Public works building police officer from job group XI to  
6 job group XIII.

7 Public works building police captain from job group XIV  
8 to job group XVII.

It is the duty of the House of Representatives to inquire into the conduct of the Executive and to report thereon to the Senate. It is the duty of the Senate to advise and consent to the appointment and removal of the Executive officers and to the ratification of treaties and to the exercise of the power of pardon.

### The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 1, Clause 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

They shall meet at the City of New York, but they may at any time, by a majority of the whole Number, change the same, and they may hold separate Sessions in different Parts of that City, and in different Counties thereof.

1. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

2. No Person shall be a Representative who shall not, when elected, have seven Years Residence in the United States; and, when elected, be seven Years a Citizen thereof; and, when elected, be, when elected, at least twenty one Years of Age; and, when elected, be, when elected, a Citizen of that State in which he shall be chosen.
