AN ACT RELATIVE TO ANTONIO CASTRO, A DISTRICT FIRE WARDEN  
WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as  
follows:*

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special  
2 law, Antonio Castro, a district fire warden in the department  
3 of natural resources, shall be placed in the same step rate in the  
4 job group that he holds with the department that he would be  
5 in had he remained with the Fall River fire department.

The Commission of Geographers

In the Year 1878

It is the duty of the Commission to report to the President of the United States, and to the Senate and House of Representatives, the results of its investigations, and to recommend such measures as may be deemed necessary for the improvement of the geographical knowledge of the United States.

The Commission is organized by the Senate and House of Representatives, and is composed of such members as may be appointed by the President, and by the authority of the Senate, in accordance with the provisions of the Act in that behalf enacted.

1. The Commission shall be organized on the first day of January, 1878, and shall continue in existence until the first day of January, 1880, unless sooner terminated by the Senate and House of Representatives.

2. The Commission shall be composed of such members as may be appointed by the President, and by the authority of the Senate, in accordance with the provisions of the Act in that behalf enacted.

3. The Commission shall have the honor of the rank of Major-General in the Army of the United States, and shall be entitled to the same precedence as Major-Generals in the Army.
