AN ACT REQUIRING THE DIRECTOR OF PERSONNEL AND STANDARDIZATION TO CREDIT CERTAIN PERSONS APPOINTED TO STATE POLICE WITH UNUSED SICK LEAVE ACCUMULATED ON OTHER SERVICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 28 of chapter 27 of the General Laws, as most re-
2 cently amended by chapter 352 of the acts of 1963, is hereby
3 further amended by adding at the end of the second paragraph
4 the following:— Any person appointed to the position of de-
5 tective in the division of state police and who previously served
6 as a police officer in a city or town, shall have credited to his
7 service with the commonwealth for the purposes of sick leave,
8 all unused sick leave accumulated in such former service.
