

HOUSE No. 3836

By Mr. Coury of New Bedford, petition of Edward P. Coury that cities and towns be authorized to designate certain highways and through ways for the purpose of having signs erected by the Department of Public Works. Transportation.

AN ACT PERMITTING CITIES AND TOWNS TO DESIGNATE CERTAIN HIGHWAYS AS THROUGHWAYS FOR THE PURPOSE OF HAVING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS PLACE TRAFFIC SIGNS OR SIGNALS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 9 of chapter 89 of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended by chapter 225 of the acts of 1962, is
3 hereby further amended by inserting after the third sentence
4 the following sentences:—Any city or town shall not be re-
5 quired to seek the approval of the department when designat-
6 ing a through way located in a thickly settled neighborhood.
7 Upon notification of any city or town of the location of a
8 throughway in a thickly settled neighborhood, the department
9 shall place a suitable warning sign or signal at or near such
10 part.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

ARTICLE I

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 4. The Times, Places and Manner of holding the Elections of Senators and Representatives, shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof; but the Congress may at any time by Law alter or amend such Regulations.

Section 5. The Congress shall assemble at least once in every Year, and such Meeting shall begin on the first Monday in December, unless they shall by Law provide otherwise.
