AN ACT EXEMPTING CERTAIN PERSONS FROM THE REQUIREMENT OF POSSESSION OF A FIREARM IDENTIFICATION CARD.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*
