## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR RECRUITMENT OF SKILLED CRAFTSMEN, ARTISANS, AND OTHER EMPLOYEES INTO COMMONWEALTH SERVICE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Paragraph 5 of section 46 of chapter 30 of the General Laws  
2 is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following:  
3 —Anything to the contrary herein notwithstanding, nothing  
4 shall prevent a public institution of higher education or the  
5 board of higher education from recruiting non-professional  
6 employees at a rate above the minimum and within the grade  
7 to which the position is allocated upon determination of the  
8 agency head that the person to be employed has served satis-  
9 factorily in a comparable position for a period of time equiv-  
10 alent to the period required by the general salary schedule had  
11 such service been entirely in the service of the commonwealth.
