By Mr. Dever of Arlington, petition of Edward J. Dever, Jr., for reducing to sixty-five the age requirement for eligibility of certain elderly persons for a real estate tax exemption. Taxation.

AN ACT REDUCING THE AGE REQUIREMENT FOR ELIGIBILITY BY CERTAIN ELDERLY PERSONS FOR A TAX EXEMPTION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Clause Forty-first of section 5 of chapter 59 of the General
2 Laws, as most recently amended by chapter 728 of the acts
3 of 1966, is hereby further amended by striking out, in lines 3,
4 5 and 6, respectively, the word "seventy", and inserting in
5 place thereof, in each instance, the word:—sixty-five.

As introduced by the Senate and House of Representatives, they were amended, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. (House bill) of chapter 22 of the General Statutes, as amended by chapter 725 of the acts of 1905, is hereby further amended by striking out in lines 2, 3 and 4, respectively, the word "seventy," and inserting in place thereof, in each instance, the word "sixty."
