### AN ACT REGULATING THE ESTABLISHING OF RENTS BY HOUSING AUTHORITIES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 26P of chapter 121 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by adding at the end the following paragraph:—
- 3 Notwithstanding any provisions of law to the contrary con-
- 4 tained in this section, no schedule of rents of any housing
- 5 authority shall be established or revised in which the rent
- 6 charged in any dwelling unit is in excess of the rent charged
- 7 in similar units by the United States government in projects
- 8 in the same general area.
