

AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING MEDICAL AND HOSPITAL SERVICES UNDER THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION LAW. *Chap. 159*

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section 30 of chapter 152 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter 233 of the acts of 1946, is hereby further amended by adding at the end the following sentence:— The provisions of this section shall be applicable so long as such services are necessary, notwithstanding the fact that maximum compensation under other sections of this chapter may have been received by the injured employee.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO CRIMES AGAINST GOVERNMENT AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THE TEACHERS' OATH LAW, SO CALLED. *Chap. 160*

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. Chapter 264 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section 11, as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition, and inserting in place thereof the following:— *Section 11.* Whoever by speech or by exhibition, distribution or promulgation of any written or printed document, paper or pictorial representation advocates, advises, counsels or incites assault upon any public official, or the killing of any person, or the unlawful destruction of real or personal property, or the overthrow by force or violence or other unlawful means of the government of the commonwealth or of the United States, shall be punished by a fine of not more than one thousand dollars, or by imprisonment for not more than three years, or both; provided, that this section shall not be construed as reducing the penalty now imposed for the violation of any law. It shall be unlawful for any person who shall have been convicted of a violation of this section, whether or not any sentence shall have been imposed, to perform the duties of a teacher or of an officer of administration in any public or private educational institution, and the superior court, in a suit by the commonwealth, shall have jurisdiction in equity to restrain and enjoin any such person from performing such duties thereafter; provided, that any such restraining order or injunction shall be forthwith vacated if such conviction shall be set aside.

Violation of teachers' oath penalized.

SECTION 2. Section 30A of chapter 71 of the General Laws, inserted by section 1 of chapter 370 of the acts of 1935, is hereby further amended by adding at the end the following sentence:— Whoever violates such oath or affirmation so far as it relates to the support of the constitution of the United States and the constitution of the commonwealth, shall be punished by a fine of not more than one thousand dollars.
