AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE COMMONWEALTH REIMBURSING CITIES AND TOWNS FOR INSTRUCTION AND TRAINING OF CERTAIN EMOTIONALLY DISTURBED CHILDREN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 46I of chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out the second paragraph and inserting
3 in place thereof the following paragraph:—

4 The actual expenses of the instruction and support of such
5 children therein, actually rendered or furnished, including
6 their necessary traveling expenses, whether daily or otherwise,
7 but not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars per year per child
8 shall be paid by the commonwealth; but the parents or guar-
9 dians of such children, who are able wholly or in part to pro-
10 vide for their support and care, to the extent of their ability
11 may be required by the department to reimburse the common-
12 wealth therefor.

7. That the committee on the Judiciary of the House of Representatives be authorized to report to the House of Representatives the results of its investigations.
8. That the committee on the Judiciary of the House of Representatives be authorized to hold such hearings as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this resolution.
9. That the committee on the Judiciary of the House of Representatives be authorized to employ such personnel as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this resolution.
10. That the committee on the Judiciary of the House of Representatives be authorized to make such expenditures as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this resolution.
