AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF MALT BEVERAGES WITHOUT A
LICENSE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

- 1 Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter one hundred
- 2 and thirty-eight of the General Laws, or any other general
- 3 or special law to the contrary, malt beverages may be sold
- 4 without a license.

The Corporation of Massachusetts

in the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine

As amended by the Senate and House of Representatives, and
approved by the Governor, on the 27th day of February, 1869.

It is enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the State, as
follows:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter one hundred
and thirty-eight of the Revised Laws, or any other general
law, or any act in this behalf, every corporation organized
in this State, and every corporation organized in any other
State, and every corporation organized in any other State,
shall be subject to the provisions of this chapter.
