AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE UNAUTHORIZED USE OF A MOTOR
VEHICLE SHALL CONSTITUTE A FELONY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 Paragraph (a) of subdivision (2) of section 24 of chapter 90
2 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out in
3 lines 22, 23 and 24, as appearing in chapter 316 of the acts of
4 1966, the words, "a fine of not less than fifty dollars nor more
5 than five hundred dollars or by imprisonment for not less than
6 thirty days nor more than two years, or both", and inserting
7 in place thereof the words:—imprisonment in the state prison
8 for not more than five years or in jail for not more than
9 two and one half years or by a fine of not more than two thou-
10 sand dollars.

The Bill of the House of Representatives for the purpose of providing for the amendment of the Constitution of the State of New York.

The Constitution of the State of New York

As amended by the Constitution of 1894

ARTICLE II. THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

Section 1. The Executive Power shall be vested in the Governor.

1. The Governor shall hold office for four years.
2. The Governor shall be elected by the people.
3. The Governor shall be eligible for re-election.
4. The Governor shall have the honor and respect due his office.
5. The Governor shall have the right to pardon and remit the punishment of all crimes.
6. The Governor shall have the right to grant reprieves and commutations of sentence.
7. The Governor shall have the right to grant pardons and commutations of sentence in cases of capital crimes.
8. The Governor shall have the right to grant pardons and commutations of sentence in cases of crimes for which the punishment is less than ten years and one-half years or a fine of not more than two thousand dollars.
