AN ACT TO ELIMINATE FROM PROBATION RECORDS ALL REFERENCE TO CRIMES WHERE THE DEFENDANT HAS BEEN PARDONED.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 100 of chapter 276 of the General Laws, as most re-
2 cently amended by chapter 623 of the acts of 1966, is hereby
3 further amended by inserting after the first sentence the follow-
4 ing two sentences:— The record of any person who has received
5 a pardon shall contain no reference to the crime nor to the par-
6 don for which it was granted, after the granting thereof by the
7 governor. Upon receipt of a certified copy of a pardon, a pro-
8 bation officer shall forthwith cause the record of a person af-
9 fected thereby to be physically changed to conform with the
10 requirement of the preceding sentence.
