AN ACT PROVIDING LIFE TENURE FOR FREDERICK HOBART, INCUMBENT OF THE OFFICE OF HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT IN THE TOWN OF HOLBROOK.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any contrary provision of law, the tenure
2 of Frederick Hobart, incumbent of the office of highway
3 superintendent of the town of Holbrook shall, upon the
4 effective date of this act, be unlimited, but he may be
5 removed therefrom for cause after hearing in the manner
6 provided by section forty-three of chapter thirty-one of the
7 General Laws.
