AN ACT MAKING IT A CRIMINAL OFFENSE FOR FAILURE TO APPOINT A PERSON TO A TEACHING POSITION WITH A UNIVERSITY OR COLLEGE BECAUSE OF HIS BLINDNESS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 19A of chapter 15 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by adding the following sentence: — Whoever violates
- 3 any provision of this section shall be punished for each offense
- 4 by imprisonment for not more than one year or by a fine of not
- 5 more than five hundred dollars, or both.
