AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF AN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES LICENSE TO ULRIC A. BENOIT AND AMELIA M. BENOIT, D/B/A FOODTOWN IN THE TOWN OF FAIRHAVEN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any limitation on the number of licenses
2 to be issued under the provisions of section seventeen of
3 chapter one hundred and thirty-eight of the General Laws,
4 but subject, however, to all other provisions of said chapter,
5 the licensing board of the town of Fairhaven is hereby au-
6 thorized to issue to Ulric A. Benoit and Amelia M. Benoit,
7 d/b/a Foodtown in the town of Fairhaven an annual license
8 to sell all alcoholic beverages not to be drunk on its premises.
9 Said license shall not be transferable to any other licensee
10 and shall not be included in the number of licenses issued un-
11 der authority of said section seventeen; provided, however,
12 that if there is an addition to the quota of such licenses in
13 said town under said section seventeen because of an increase
14 in population in said town, then said license shall be included in
15 such new quota.
