AN ACT VALIDATING THE ACTS AND PROCEEDINGS AT THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING OF THE TOWN OF WRENTHAM IN NINETEEN HUNDRED AND SIXTY-NINE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The acts and proceedings of the town of Wren-  
2 tham at the annual town meeting held in the year nineteen  
3 hundred and sixty-nine, and all acts in pursuance thereof,  
4 are hereby confirmed and made valid, notwithstanding the  
5 failure of allowing the required period of time to elapse be-  
6 tween the posting of the warrant and the holding of said  
7 meeting as required by law, to the same extent as if said an-  
8 nual meeting had been called, held, conducted and adjourned  
9 in strict compliance with the law.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

**THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES**

The Constitution of the United States is the supreme law of the land. It is the foundation of the government and the rights of the people. It is the source of all powers and authority in the United States.

**ARTICLE I**

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.

Section 3. This article shall extend to all Territories which may at any time be admitted into the Union as States.
