AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING OVERTIME PAY FOR MEMBERS OF THE POLICE FORCE OF THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 Chapter 92 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 striking out section 62, as most recently amended by section 1
3 of chapter 730 of the acts of 1950, and inserting in place
4 thereof the following section:—

5 *Section 62.* Notwithstanding any provisions of the law to
6 the contrary, members of the police force of the commission
7 shall have two consecutive days off in each period of seven
8 days, except that, in case of any public emergency, or of any
9 unusual demand for the services of said force, the commis-
10 sioner or the superintendent of said force may assign the
11 authorized number of days off in such manner and at such
12 time as will assure the maximum use of said force.
