## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF WALTHAM TO CONTINUE TO EMPLOY VERONICA DEEHAN AS HEAD CLERK OF SAID CITY NOTWITHSTANDING THAT SHE HAS REACHED THE MAXIMUM RETIREMENT AGE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any contrary provision of chapter thirty-  
2 two of the General Laws the city of Waltham is hereby au-  
3 thorized to employ Veronica Deehan as head clerk of said  
4 city. Provided that there shall be deducted from the com-  
5 pensation for her services in the position an amount equal to  
6 the retirement allowance received by her.

# THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

## ARTICLE I

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

### SECTION 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be admitted into or excluded from this Union according to their respective Numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole Number of free Persons, (including bound Persons for the Term of Years) and to three fourths of all other Persons bound to Service, the Number of free Persons in each State.

3. The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

4. No Representative shall be chosen for a Term longer than two Years; but he shall be eligible for Re-election immediately after he has finished his Term.

5. The House of Representatives shall be assembled once in every Year, and the Meeting shall be on the first Monday in December, unless they shall by Law appoint another Day.

6. The Congress shall assemble at least once in every Year, and the Session shall begin on the first Monday in December, unless they shall by Law appoint another Day.
