AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE RECREATION COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF NEWTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any provision of section fourteen of
2 chapter forty-five of the General Laws, the city of Newton
3 may by ordinance establish a recreation commission consist-
4 ing of a recreation commissioner and one resident from each
5 of the wards in said city. The powers conferred by said sec-
6 tion, except the power of eminent domain, may be exercised
7 by a committee consisting of one member of the recreation
8 commission of the said city of Newton, such member to be
9 appointed and designated in accordance with the ordinances
10 of said city of Newton. The other members of the commis-
11 sion shall be designated or elected in such manner and for
12 such terms as the board of aldermen may determine.
