AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PRIORITIES TO BE USED BY HOUSING AUTHORITIES IN OFFERING CERTAIN RESIDENCES FOR SALE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Subdivision (e) of section 26NN of chapter 121 of the General
2 Laws, as amended by section 5 of chapter 550 of the acts of 1952,
3 is hereby further amended by striking out clauses (5), (6), (7)
4 and (8) and inserting in place thereof the following five clauses:—
5 (5) any other housing authority funded by either state or federal
6 monies or both whose purpose is to provide decent housing for
7 persons or families of low income who are residents or inhabi-
8 tants of the county in which the residences are located; (6) all
9 other resident citizens of the city or town in which the said
10 residences are located; (7) all other citizens of the common-
11 wealth of Massachusetts; (8) an urban redevelopment corpora-
12 tion; and (9) all others.

The Constitution of Massachusetts

In the Year of the Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-Six

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS, AS REVISED AND AMENDED TO THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SIX.

ARTICLE I.

SECTION I.

1. The legislative power shall be vested in a Senate and House of Representatives, who shall be styled the Senate and the Representatives of the People of the Commonwealth, and shall be styled in all Acts and Records the Senate and House of Representatives.

2. The Senate shall be composed of not more than eight members, and the House of Representatives of not more than thirty members, chosen by the People of the Commonwealth, in the manner hereinafter provided.

3. The Senate shall be chosen by the qualified electors of the Commonwealth, and the House of Representatives by the qualified electors of the several towns and cities of the Commonwealth.

4. The Senate shall be elected for a term of two years, and the House of Representatives for a term of one year, and shall be eligible for re-election.

5. The Senate shall be organized on the first day of January next after the election, and the House of Representatives on the first day of September next after the election.

6. The Senate shall be organized on the first day of January next after the election, and the House of Representatives on the first day of September next after the election.
