AN ACT INCREASING THE AMOUNT OF ANNUAL PENSION PAYABLE TO CERTAIN PERSONS RETIRED FOR PHYSICAL OR MENTAL DISABILITY CAUSED BY ILLNESS OR INJURY INCURRED IN PERFORMANCE OF DUTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Clause (ii) of paragraph (b) of subdivision (2) of section 26
2 of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as appearing in section 3 of
3 chapter 446 of the acts of 1948, is hereby amended by striking
4 out in lines 1 and 3, the words "two thirds," and inserting in
5 place thereof, in each instance, the words: — seventy-two per-
6 cent, — so as to read as follows: — (ii) A yearly amount of
7 pension equal to seventy-two percent of the annual rate of his
8 regular compensation on the date such illness or injury was
9 incurred, or equal to seventy-two percent of the average annual
10 rate of his regular compensation for the twelve-month period
11 for which he last received regular compensation immediately
12 preceding the date his retirement allowance becomes effective,
13 whichever is greater.
