AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TUITION FEES OF NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS IN STATE COLLEGES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 6 of chapter 73 of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended by section 12 of chapter 642 of the acts of
3 1963, is hereby further amended by adding the following
4 sentence: —

5 Such fees may be fixed in excess of those fixed under
6 section one A, and in no event shall the amount be less than
7 that charged by the state of residence of such student to
8 residents of the commonwealth attending state colleges of such
9 states.

The Committee on Education and the Arts

has the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 10th instant.

The Committee is currently reviewing the matter and will advise you of the results of its deliberations.
