### AN ACT FORBIDDING STATE SUBSIDIES TO CERTAIN MEDICAL SCHOOLS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any law, no medical
- 2 school having a freshman class composed of less than seventy-
- 3 five per cent bona fide residents of the commonwealth shall
- 4 be entitled to any state subsidy.
- 5 For the purpose of this act the residency must have existed
- 6 for five years or more prior to the date of application for
- 7 admission.
