AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CLASSIFICATIONS OF RISKS AND PREMIUM CHARGES UNDER THE COMPULSORY MOTOR VEHICLE LIABILITY INSURANCE LAW BE UNIFORM THROUGHOUT THE COMMONWEALTH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 113B of chapter 175 of the General  
2 Laws is hereby amended by striking out the first sentence of  
3 the first paragraph, and inserting in place thereof the following  
4 sentences: — The commissioner shall, annually on or before  
5 September fifteenth, after due hearing and investigation, fix  
6 and establish fair and reasonable classifications of risks, and  
7 adequate, just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory premium  
8 charges to be used and charged by companies in connection  
9 with the issue or execution of motor vehicle liability policies or  
10 bonds, both as defined in section thirty-four A of chapter  
11 ninety, for the ensuring calendar year or any part thereof. But  
12 said classifications and premium charges shall be uniform  
13 throughout the commonwealth and shall not be fixed or estab-  
14 lished according to districts or zones.

1 SECTION 2. Section 113C of chapter 175 of the General  
2 Laws is hereby amended by striking the second sentence of the

3 second paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following  
4 new sentence: — The rates for other than fire, theft, compre-  
5 hensive and collision insurance shall be subject to the approval  
6 of the commissioner under the provisions of section one  
7 hundred and thirteen B provided that classification of rates and  
8 premium charges for all coverages under this section shall be  
9 uniform throughout the commonwealth and shall not be fixed  
10 or established according to districts or zones.
