AN ACT ESTABLISHING A MINIMUM RETIREMENT BENEFIT TO BE PAID TO RETIRED SCHOOL TEACHERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provision of any law no retired school
2 teacher shall receive a retirement benefit of less than three
3 thousand dollars per year.

The Constitutionality of the Act

In the Year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two

AN ACT ESTABLISHING A MINIMUM STANDARD FOR ALL TO BE USED AS A
SCHOOL TEACHER. PUBLIC SCHOOLS

It is enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of
the General Court assembled, and by the authority of the State, we
ordain:

1. Notwithstanding the provision of any law to the contrary,
no teacher shall receive a permanent tenure of his term of
office until he has received a minimum standard of his term of
office.
