AN ACT REPEALING THE LAW PROVIDING FOR PRE-PRIMARY CONVEN-TIONS OF POLITICAL PARTIES AND REVIVING AND CONTINUING IN FORCE CERTAIN OTHER LAWS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Section 1. All provisions of sections fifty-four, fifty-four C, 2 fifty-four D and chapter fifty-three of the General Laws, as
- 3 most recently amended by chapter two hundred and thirty of
- 4 the acts of nineteen hundred and fifty-eight, providing for
- 5 state conventions of political parties for the endorsement for
- 6 nomination of candidates for offices to be filled by all the
- 7 voters of the commonwealth, and all other laws relative to
- 8 such conventions, are hereby repealed.
- Section 2. All provisions of law which have been stricken
- 2 or amended by said sections fifty-four, fifty-four C, fifty-four
- 3 D of chapter fifty-three of the General Laws, as most recently
- 4 amended by chapter two hundred and thirty of the acts of
- 5 nineteen hundred and fifty-eight, or by any other law relative
- 6 to such conventions, are hereby revived as they existed
- 7 immediately prior to such striking or amendment, subject,
- 8 however, to all subsequent amendments not relating to such
- 9 conventions, all of which subsequent amendments are hereby
- 10 continued in force.
