By Mr. Grimaldi of Springfield, petition of James L. Grimaldi relative to the appearance of deputy sheriffs or court officers at sittings of district courts. Counties.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE APPEARANCE OF DEPUTY SHERIFFS OR COURT OFFICERS AT THE SITTING OF A DISTRICT COURT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 69 of chapter 221 of the General Laws, as appearing
2 in the Tercentenary Edition, is hereby amended by adding the
3 following paragraph: —

4 If a justice of a district court and the District Attorney in
5 writing require the attendance of deputy sheriffs or court
6 officers at a District Court sitting, the sheriff shall provide
7 same, and they shall be paid as provided by Section seventy-
8 five.

It is the intent of the Board of Health to provide for the protection of the public health by the regulation of the practice of medicine and the issuance of licenses to persons who practice medicine.

The Commission of Health

has the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 10th day of August, 1937.

It is noted that you are desirous of being licensed as a physician and surgeon in the State of Illinois.

In order to be eligible for licensure you must have graduated from a medical school which is recognized by the State Board of Health.

It is noted that you have not yet received your diploma from the medical school from which you graduated.

If you have received your diploma, you should submit a copy of the same to the Board of Health. If you have not yet received your diploma, you should contact the medical school from which you graduated to determine the status of your records.
