AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION PLANS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1G of chapter 15 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by inserting after the seventh paragraph the following

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
