### AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARIES OF THE ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEYS FOR THE PLYMOUTH DISTRICT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 16 of chapter 12 is hereby amended by striking out  
2 the seventh paragraph and inserting in place thereof the follow-  
3 ing paragraph: —

4 For the Plymouth District, one assistant, twelve thousand,  
5 five hundred dollars; one assistant, eleven thousand, five hun-  
6 dred dollars; and three assistants, ten thousand, five hundred  
7 dollars.
