AN ACT DESIGNATING AN AREA NEAR THE BRIDGE OVER INTER-STATE ROUTE 495 AT ROUTE 110 IN THE TOWN OF METHUEN AS THE WILLIAM A. DIXON MEMORIAL.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 This area (so called Cook's Corner) near the intersection of  
2 interstate highway 495 and state highway 110 in the town of  
3 Methuen shall be known and designated as the William Dixon  
4 Memorial, in memory of William A. Dixon who served and died  
5 for this country during World War I in France, 1918.

6 A suitable marker bearing said designation shall be attached  
7 thereto by the Department of Public Works.

By the Bureau of Marine Fisheries of Michigan, Bureau  
of the Department of Public Works, in answer to a resolution  
of the House of Representatives, passed July 1, 1914,  
relating to the Michigan A. S. Fish Hatchery, Grand Haven.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE  
WILSON'S PHOENIX

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
of the United States of America, in Congress assembled,  
January 1, 1914.

Section 1. That the Secretary of the Interior  
shall cause to be printed and distributed to the  
public, in pamphlet form, the report of the  
Commissioner of the General Land Office, dated  
January 1, 1914, on the subject of the  
Wilson's Phoenix.
