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## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT REDUCING THE AMOUNT OF THE ASSESSMENT OF THE TOWN OF WAKEFIELD FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF RESERVATIONS AND BOULEVARDS IN THE METROPOLITAN PARKS DISTRICT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 55 of chapter 92 of the General Laws, as  
2 appearing in section 1 of chapter 554 of the acts of 1949, is  
3 hereby amended by striking out the last sentence and insert-  
4 ing in place thereof the following sentence:—The thirty-nine  
5 per cent charged as assessments on the various cities and  
6 towns in said parks district shall be based upon one third in  
7 proportion to their populations and the remaining two thirds  
8 in proportion to their valuations, the town of Wakefield shall  
9 pay only fifty per cent of its respective proportion with the  
10 remaining fifty per cent to be charged against all other cities  
11 and towns in said parks district as part of their assessments.
