RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION OF THE FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHING A REGISTRATION BOARD OF AMBULANCE OWNERS, OPERATORS AND ATTENDANTS AND ANY OTHER RELATED MATTERS.

1 *Resolved.* That a special commission, to consist of two
2 members of the senate, three members of the house of repre-
3 sentatives, and four persons to be appointed by the governor, is
4 hereby established for the purpose of making an investigation
5 and study of the feasibility of establishing a registration board
6 for ambulance owners, operators and attendants and any other
7 related matters.

The House of Representatives of the United States of America, in session at the City of Washington, on the 10th day of January, 1917, passed the following resolution:

The Government is authorized
